

Loyalty

No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one. and love the other: or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon. (Matthew 6:24 KJV)

Once upon a time, workers spent an entire career working loyally for the same company. In those days, companies worked under the principles, "Take care of your workers, and your workers will take care of you", and, "A happy worker is a loyal worker". Business owners paid well, gave good benefits, rewarded people for hard work, and instilled a deep sense of loyalty to the company brand and its product(s) - often a lifetime loyalty.

It seems as if these ideas belong already to our fathers' and grandfathers' era. Is it because of the fast pace of 21st Century life? Nowadays, with global communication available at the touch of a button, with hundreds of television channels available 24 hours a day, and all things vying for our attention at all times, the notion of flitting from one source to another and not sticking with anything for a protracted period of time appears to have won the day. It is as if loyalty is out, and our attention, our custom, our love is won by the most vociferous, most novel bidder the one who pays the highest price and thus gains the longest air time on our endless social media channels.

It is not, of course, that one should not look around and be informed about what is on offer - it does however seem that the pace of our modern lives would do well to slow down and allow us all time to settle into deep study and reflection, building up loyalty to our family, friends, community, and (above all else) to our fellow humans - turning our attention to the second half of Jesus' double law (Matthew 22:39) Love your neighbor as yourself'. In so doing, we will be pointing ourselves in the right direction for the first half: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and all your mind."

In an age that seems to be permeated by ever-decreasing loyalty, it is imperative that Christians cling to this virtue. After all, in loyalty there is security, goodwill, and devotedness. Relationships flourish when protected by loyalty. True in business. True in relationships. True in faith.

In Matthew 6, Jesus addresses loyalty as a choice: a choice between loyalty to God or loyalty to mammon. God's loyalty to us is constant and sure. Our loyalty to God, his church and his truth ought to respond to his loyalty with our own loyalty. Loyalty in the business world may be a waning ideal, but in the things of God, loyalty must continue to grow and thrive. May loyalty ever describe those engaged in the things of God.
