**YORK**

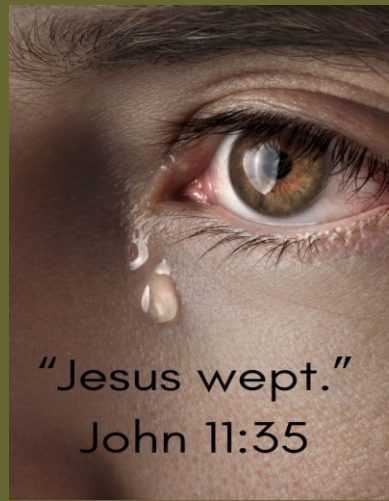
*Inequality for York*  
 York was the only black American on the Lewis-Clark expedition to investigate the newly acquired Louisiana Purchase of the United States in 1804. York is in many ways an enigmatic figure. He was apparently about the same age as William Clark; William inherited York as a slave in 1799 from his father. In appearance, York was a massive and imposing figure, and he was as strong as a bear. Despite being enslaved, York played a full part in the expedition : his strength was vital to the expedition's success, and with the rifle he carried he supplied the expedition with meat. Additionally, when a vote was needed to decide what was to be done next, York's voice counted the same as the other (white) members'. During the expedition's encounters with Native Americans, it is said that the chiefs of the various tribes were fascinated and amazed : York was the first black person they had ever seen.

After the successful expedition, William Clark expected York to return to his ordinary role as body servant - but after the freedom he had experienced during the two years of adventure, York was profoundly unhappy. Despite his contributions to the Corps of Discovery, Clark refused to release York from bondage upon returning east. While all the other explorers enjoyed rewards of double pay and hundreds of acres of land, York received nothing. After the end of the expedition, Clark allowed York only a brief visit to Kentucky to see his wife before forcing him to return to Missouri. It is unlikely that he ever saw his wife again. It is not certain what finally happened to him : he remained enslaved for a further 5 years until about 1811 when it is supposed he ran away from his master and may have ended in Montana, or Wyoming, where a black man was regularly seen by various traders, living with Crow Indians.

*Equality in Christ*  
 The inequalities that marked the world that York lived in have, thankfully, slowly eroded over the past 200 years. And yet, one view of the evening news reminds us just how far we have to go.
