
Information about Northside's Adult Bible Classes

Epaphroditus (Philippians 2:25-30)

Just outside the margins of the well-known narratives of Paul, Silus, Timothy, Barnabas and Luke lie many lesser-known co-workers of Paul. Epaphroditus is one such man. Most of what we know about Epaphroditus is given to us in the Philippian letter, Chapter Two.

Risked his life for Christ: We can only imagine the perils of First Century travel, especially when anti-Christian forces lurked around every corner. Illness, exposure to the elements, inclement weather all added to the risks of travel. Paul, in praise of Epaphroditus, urges the Philippians to lovingly welcome and honor him "because he almost died for the work of Christ, risking his life" (*Philippians 2:30*).

Brother: Paul calls Epaphroditus his brother, and it is clear throughout this part of the letter that Paul is very concerned indeed for Epaphroditus' wellbeing. Although he is not a member of Paul's family, it is as if he were a beloved brother - not only because Epaphroditus helps Paul in his work of spreading the gospel, but because Paul has adopted him in his heart and is truly concerned for his welfare. Paul's family now consists of all the family of Christ (Epaphroditus and Timothy are two examples), and we can see Paul's emotional personality in these relationships. This must have been a big spur and encouragement to Paul in the difficult work he was doing.

Fellow Soldier: The choice of these words also reveals an important side to the job of spreading the word of Christ that Paul and his team were engaged on. This was no joy ride: apart from the hardship of trudging from place to place over long distances on foot, there was the repeated risk that the Jews (and others) would reject their message and pelt them with stones or other missiles. Epaphroditus was in Christ's fighting battalion alongside Paul, ready for any action.

Fellow Worker and Messenger: In quieter moments, whenever they were received in peace and with loving understanding, then Paul and his helpers were able to bring their message of peace, love and hope. This was often in the homes of other believers, but could have also been in market places and in synagogues.

Having a deeper understanding of the many lesser known co-workers of Paul magnifies the fact that it "takes a village" to successfully do the good works of Christ. And although Paul, Barnabas, Silas, Luke and others are the men we know best, the importance of these lesser co-workers was invaluable for the cause of Christ.


