

A Most Difficult Command

"You have heard that it was said, 'Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth.'
But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also" (Matthew 5:38-39).

Turning the other cheek is not natural. How difficult it is to resist striking back when every fiber of my being is telling me to respond to insult with insult, or to strike back at the cheek of the person who has struck mine. What extraordinary courage, confidence and trust in God it takes to rely on the power of God when I want to take things into my own hands. The New Testament bears repeated witness to men and women who lived in this way from Stephen onwards. But there are also Old Testament examples: Joseph (Genesis 37-50) and even David (1 Samuel 26:9-11) who show their greatness in this way. Our best example is Jesus: the way of the cross, the way of non-violence – the way of complete surrender and reliance upon God to right all wrongs.

The greatest respect is brought about by rising above a violent situation and overcoming it with love, faith and reliance upon God. Being so committed to the love and Lordship of Christ that one renounces all ideas of retaliation is surely the mark of the most convinced Christian. Romans 12:18-21 says it all: If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Do not take revenge, my friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord. On the contrary: "If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

It is important to note that this difficult command, from Matthew 5, is a personal one. It applies to me, myself, and my own personal responses to personal attacks. A government's response to violence against its citizens is scripturally guided by a different standard: protection – protecting its citizens from harm (Romans 13:3ff).

To be obedient to this turn-the-other-cheek command, Christians must push back against their basic instincts of retaliation. After all, turning the other cheek is NOT natural. The natural response to strike back. Turning the other cheek is a great sign of personal strength and trust; it is not weakness. After all, anyone can hit back. Few can find the courage to allow God to fight all their battles and right all their wrongs. Stephen Powers
