



We Can Imagine (Mark 10:46-52)

A blind man

There is the famous story of the teacher who asked her class to write an essay entitled "Would you prefer to be blind or deaf??" Once you get over the shock of the formulation, you can kinda "see" what she meant. Blind people are deprived of our major sense, but can hear, converse and socialize; deaf people however are confined to their own inner world. Imagine being blind in 1st century Jericho. There would be no way to earn your living except begging; there would be no support groups, except your own family; and blindness would have been much more prevalent then anyway without the health care we take for granted. Bartimaeus may have suffered the misfortune of being blind - perhaps he was even born blind - but he possesses insight - seeing Jesus, and into Jesus, in a way the sighted people did not.

Many rebuked him

We can only imagine the excitement that permeated the city of Jericho because of Jesus' visit – with large crowds of curious citizens clamoring about hoping to get a good look at this teacher and worker of miracles. When Bartimaeus realized that it was Jesus who was passing his roadside begging spot, he began to cry out, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Rather than help him get closer to Jesus, those nearby began to rebuke Bartimaeus, telling him to "be quiet" (Mark 10:48). But Bartimaeus is unwilling to let this once-only opportunity pass him by. If he remains silent, he will take his blindness with him to his grave. No. This was his moment. Undeterred by the crowd's discouragement, he shouted even more, and this time Jesus called for him. The Bible tells us that Bartimaeus "jumped to his feet" and came to Jesus." Jesus healed him. We can only imagine the moment that Bartimaeus began to see the people, places and things around him.


Immediately he received his sight

Once he regained his physical sight, Bartimaeus did not hesitate: he joined Jesus and walked with him. We can imagine how different his life was after his healing. We imagine the strength of the renewed Bartimaeus: his insight and his sight united in the service of Jesus, and from the healing moment onwards he became a follower, an example of faith, dedication and resolve. Beggar no longer, Bartimaeus henceforth wears the mantle of disciple, and bears witness to the strength of his faith and total belief in Jesus' power. Let us show the same conviction as blind Bartimaeus; let us put all our trust in Jesus – bearing witness ourselves to God's healing love.


